

Valiant Comics Timeline Introduction

I'm a huge Star Trek fan. I own all the DVD's, read the books and comics, I even have a Trek tattoo. When I was a kid I got the Star Trek Chronology by Denise and Michael Okuda for Christmas. Even though most of the information in that book can now be found online I still prefer my old, beat up, less-a-book-and-more-a-folder-because-the-glue-couldn't-hold, copy of the chronology.

Earlier this year I got a copy of the Babylon 5 Chronologies. It's a fascinating book that has two different interpretations of the Babylon 5 timeline. Two different people watched the same show and both decided to make a timeline. On some things the two agreed, and on others they differed, but they were both right because it was they're interpretation of what they watched. Even now my copy is becoming less a book and more folder.

As I was reading through it I realized that it was time to do something I had always wanted to do: make a timeline of the Valiant Comics Universe.

With my wife's and father's encouragement I dived in. I re-read all comics, making notes on my computer as I went along. I arranged my timeline in a similar style to Denise and Michael Okuda's, whose work I loved so much.

When you see the word conjecture that just means that this event was not given a specific date and its placement is my best guess. A conjecture note is always followed by an explanation. Some references are based on our own historical dates unless specifically contradicted by dialogue in a comic. For instance, in the Valiant Universe the Texas War of Independence started sooner than in our own timeline.

For some issues without a date I used the month the comic was scheduled to ship.

I'd like to thank Jim Shooter, Bob Layton, Steve Massarsky and all the other writers, artists, inkers, letterers, editors, and executives that made Valiant Comics. I'd like to also acknowledge the work of Seaborn Adamson, a man whose enthusiasm for Valiant is infectious.

- 13.75 Billion Years Ago** Solar, the Man of the Atom, creates a time portal in Ladakh, Tibet in the year 1994 to dispose of the necromantic energy known as the Chaos Effect. The energy is sent to the beginning of time, to the big bang and the creation of the universe. The Lost Land is also created at this time.
(Conjecture: The universe is believed to be approximately 13.75 billion years old.)(Chaos Effect Omega)
- After having a fight with his girlfriend, Gayle Nordheim, in 1995, Solar slips into the time stream to witness the beginnings of the universe.
(Solar, Man of the Atom #49)
- 4.5 Billion Years Ago** While travelling the cosmos Solar finds a solar system remarkably similar to Earth's. He decides to make amends for previous sins and reshape this planet to be a replica of Earth.
(Conjecture: Assumes the solar system he finds is the same age as our own.)(Editor's Note: For more information on this new Earth Solar creates go to the Brave New World appendix.)
(Solar, Man of the Atom #49)
- 67 Million Years Ago** Having arrived from the year 1998, Ivar the Timewalker, and the android Prometheus, battle amongst the dinosaurs of the Cretaceous Period. Ivar escapes and spends the next three months surviving and waiting for a time arc. When a time arc arrives, Prometheus returns and the two are sucked in together. They battle each other in the time arc. Prometheus is deposited in the year 2420 B.C. and Ivar goes to the year 1625.
(Conjecture: The dinosaurs pictured appear to be those found in the Cretaceous era.)
(Timewalker #4)
- 66 Million Years Ago** Having arrived from the year 1993, Shadowman, a man transformed by voodoo and empowered at night, travels through time for Master Darque, a necromancer, and encounters dinosaurs.
(Conjecture: The dinosaurs pictured appear to be those found in the Cretaceous era.)
(Shadowman #21)
- 65 Million Years Ago** The Late Cretaceous Period, the time period that saw the end of the dinosaurs.
(X-O Manowar #7)
- Having arrived from the year 4002, Ivar the Timewalker surveys his new surroundings.
(Magnus Robot Fighter #33)
- A seismic event creates the Mediterranean Sea. Ivar barely escapes the tidal wave by catching a time arc that brings him to the year 1992.
(Timewalker Yearbook #1)
- 3 Million Years Ago** An alien spaceship crash lands on Earth. The dying alien inside the ship implants his genetic code into a monkey. The genetic code lies dormant within the monkey's ancestors for millions of years.
(Conjecture: Happened "a few million" years ago.)(The Outcast #1)

- 15,000 B.C.** The Spider Aliens, a race of aliens that feed on the flesh and blood of other races, discover a semi-sentient, silicon based life form. They use this life form to begin forging exoskeletal armor.
(Conjecture: "Millennia in the past.")(X-O Database #1)
- 8009 B.C.** The X-O Manowar armor Shanhara is forged by the Spider Aliens. The Manowar class armor is the strongest armor developed by the Spider Aliens.
(X-O Manowar #0)
- 5000 B.C.** Beginning of the Neolithic Period, end of the Stone Age.
(Valiant Voice #2)
- 3500 B.C.** Khanit, a nomadic tribesman, is chosen by the Earth to be its first Geomancer. A Geomancer is able to communicate with inanimate objects, and even with the Earth itself. Khanit is also given a longer lifespan and limited control over the elements.
(Valiant Voice #2)(Geomancer #8)
- 3366 B.C.** Valurr confronts his father Khanit, whose Geomantic powers have corrupted him.
(Geomancer #7)
- Valurr defeats his father after the Earth strips Khanit of his powers. Valurr becomes the next Geomancer, but unlike his father, he is mortal and has no elemental power.
(Geomancer #8)
- 3352 B.C.** Valurr, the Geomancer, defeats Ulst, a being who wields necromantic power.
(Geomancer #3)
- 3289 B.C.** Jahk'rt, a bio-manipulator from the year 4500, and her ship crash after having travelled through time. Spider Aliens witness the event and are intrigued. She begins working with them to develop time travel technology.
(Timewalker #0)(Editor's Note: The date of 3289 is based on Gilad being born in the year 3141. Many dates have been given throughout Valiant's history as to the possible date of Gilad's birth. This timeline reflects events in Eternal Warrior #1 and the story "The Formation of the Sect" in the Archer & Armstrong hardcover.)
- 3189 B.C.** Jahk'rt sends 50 Spider Aliens through a time portal in her quest to master time travel.
(Timewalker #0)
- 3159 B.C.** Jahk'rt sends a Spider Alien ship through a time portal in her quest to master time travel.
(Timewalker #0)
- 3143 B.C.** Vandal, a genetically superior human, and his pregnant wife Triahna escape from Jahk'rt and the Spider Aliens.
(Timewalker #0)

Ivar Anni-Padda, the son of Vandal and Triahna, is born.
(Editor's Note: Valiant Voice #2 places this event in 3270 B.C.)

3141 B.C. Gilad Anni-Padda, the brother of Ivar, is born.
(Editor's Note: Valiant Voice #2 places this event in 3268 B.C.)

3139 B.C. Aram Anni-Padda, also known as Armstrong and the brother of Ivar and Gilad, is born.
(Archer & Armstrong Hardcover – The Formation of the Sect – Birthday Blast) (Editor's Note: Valiant Voice #2 places this event in 3266 B.C.)

Timewalker #0 – “Child of Time”

Triahna dies giving birth to Aram. Ivar runs away from their village upset. When he returns to the village he discovers that it was attacked by Spider Aliens. He cannot find his father or two brothers. Ivar is captured by a Spider Alien and brought to Jahk'rt.
(Timewalker #0)

3135 B.C. Shepsut, the future wife of Aram, is born.
(Harbinger #9)

3130 B.C. Gilad single-handedly stops invaders from taking over his village.
(Eternal Warrior #1)(Editor's Note: Valiant Voice #2 places this event in 3257 B.C.)

3124 B.C. Eternal Warrior #37 – “Childhood's End, Part 1”
Gilad and Aram's hunting party are attacked by Spider Aliens. Gilad discovers that he can survive mortal wounds. After a discussion with Vandal and Aram, Gilad storms off. When he returns to the village he finds that it has been destroyed by the Spider Aliens.
(Conjecture: Assumes Gilad is 17.)(Editor's Note: The caption says 3214 B.C.)(Editor's Note: Vandal tells Gilad and Aram that he's not their father, but other issues contradict this. This timeline ignores this plot point.)

Eternal Warrior #38 – “Childhood's End, Part 2”

Gilad fights against the Spider Alien Queen and frees his people.

3123 B.C. Aram's first wife Shepsut gives birth.
(Conjecture: Assumes Aram had his first child when he was 16.)(Harbinger #9)

Kalam, the Son of Gilad, is born.
(Valiant Voice #2)(Conjecture: Assumes the Valiant Voice timeline had the right distance between years even though it did not always have the right dates. Valiant Voice #2 places this event in 3250 B.C.)

3100 B.C. Gilad and Aram's village is destroyed after an attempted raid. They are the only survivors. Aram and Gilad go their separate ways. Gilad follows the Geomancer and becomes the Fist and Steel of the Earth.
(Eternal Warrior #1)(Eternal Warrior #40)(Editor's Note: Valiant Voice #2 places this event in 3219 B.C.)

- 3039 B.C.** Jahk'rt tells Ivar that he can succeed at being a time traveler because his body can withstand the abuse of a time arc. Ivar escapes from Jahk'rt and finds a young woman. The two are recaptured by the Spider Aliens. Ivar escapes again with the girl and steals the tachyon compass, a device that can assist in navigating through time. After fighting off several Spider Aliens, Ivar and the girl jump into a time arc and travel to the year 1850.
(Timewalker #0)
- 3000 B.C.** After a long night of heavy drinking Armstrong constructs the monument we now know as Stonehenge.
(Conjecture: Parts of Stonehenge were built as early as ca. 3100 B.C.)(Secrets of the Valiant Universe #1 – Eternal Warrior)
- 2589 B.C.** Beginning of the 23-year reign of Cheops in Egypt, during which he constructs the Great Pyramid.
(Valiant Voice #2)(Editor's Note: Valiant Voice #2 places this event in 2627 B.C.)
- 2585 B.C.** Gilad visits the ruins of his birthplace.
(Eternal Warrior #1)
- 2576 B.C.** Armstrong entertains Pharaoh Khufu, known to the Greek as Cheops.
(Conjecture: Sometime during Khufu's reign.)(Archer & Armstrong Hardcover – The Formation of the Sect – Birthday Blast)(Editor's Note: Valiant Voice #2 places this event in 2614 B.C.)
- Gilad visits his brother in Egypt.
(Eternal Warrior #1)
- 2420 B.C.** Having arrived from the Cretaceous Period, Prometheus the android ends up in Macedonia where he is worshipped as a god.
(Timewalker #4)
- 1370 B.C.** **June 10** – Ivar and Nefertiti, Queen of the Nile make love on a gondola. Ivar is pulled into a time arc.
(Archer & Armstrong #11)(Editor's Note: In Timewalker #9 Ivar talks about Nefertiti living in 1423 B.C. In our own history books Nefertiti was born in 1370 B.C.)
- 1184 B.C.** Armstrong is present at the fall of Troy. So is Gilad.
(Shadowman #5)(Eternal Warrior #27)(Conjecture: This date is one of many in which historians believe the fall of Troy took place.)
- 642 B.C.** Hellion is born in what will later be called Acclamation, Oregon.
(PunX #2)
- 577 B.C.** A group, who later helps found The Sect, begins hunting Armstrong.
(Archer & Armstrong #0)(Editor's Note: Mahmud said his group has been hunting Armstrong for 2,569 years.)

- 490 B.C.** A group of middle easterners gathers strength and resources to ascertain who helped Nebuchadnezzar conquer Jerusalem.
(Archer & Armstrong Hardcover – The Formation of the Sect – Birthday Blast)
- 481 B.C.** A group of middle easterners begins hunting for Armstrong, believing him to be an agent of Nebuchadnezzar.
(Archer & Armstrong Hardcover – The Formation of the Sect – Birthday Blast)
- 400 B.C.** The Chinese invent small kite-like hot air balloons and fireworks.
(Vintage Magnus Robot Fighter #4)
- 326 B.C. **Eternal Warrior #23 – “Blind Fate”****
Hephaestion, the Geomancer, helps Alexander the Great widen his empire. Gilad opposes him and is captured. Hephaestion orders Gilad’s eyes be put out with hot pokers.
- 324 B.C.** Hephaestion is killed by the new Geomancer, Khadania.
(Geomancer #4)
- Autumn** – Gilad is freed from prison. He is still blinded from Hephaestion’s torture. With the help of Khadania, the new Geomancer, Gilad learns to fight despite his blindness. Gilad eventually regains his sight.
(Eternal Warrior #23)
- 300 B.C.** The City of Dura Europus is founded on the banks of the Euphrates River.
(Timewalker #10)
- 218 B.C.** Armstrong meets Hannibal and shows off his strength by lifting an elephant. Hannibal’s men attack Armstrong.
(Conjecture: Event is placed the year Hannibal crossed the Alps with 30 war elephants.)(Archer & Armstrong #0)
- 210 B.C.** Emperor Qin Shi Huang of China dies. He has no heirs, so two cousins, Chin Lee and Huang Lin fight to be emperor. Huang Lin is supported by Li-Sung, who is the Geomancer. Chin Lee is supported by General Cheng, who is the first incarnation of the Immortal Enemy. Gilad kills Chin Lee and captures Cheng. He brings Cheng to Huang Lin, who offers him leniency, but Cheng commits suicide.
(Eternal Warrior #4)(Valiant Voice #2)
- 73 B.C.** Gilad walks the Appian Way, witnessing the crucifixion of thousands of slaves lead by Spartacus.
(Eternal Warrior #7)
- 54 B.C.** Julius Caesar conquers the Britons.
(Timewalker #1)
- 50 B.C.** Armstrong meets Cleopatra, queen of Egypt.
(Conjecture: At some point during Cleopatra’s reign.)(Archer & Armstrong #25)

- 35 B.C.** Crescendo, a queen of a Middle Eastern country, is attacked and her kingdom is destroyed by a group of Visigoths seeking plunder. They take Crescendo as spoils of war.
(Conjecture: After Cleopatra becomes pharaoh of Egypt, but before the Roman invasion of Egypt.)(X-O Manowar #47)
- 12 B.C.** Gandhyrras, the Geomancer, enlists Gilad to kill Tvashtar, a leader of a dangerous cult. Gilad uses the Bagh-Nakh knife, a knife that captures the soul, to kill him.
(Eternal Warrior #6)
- 10 B.C.** Armstrong leaves his wife Kiraz and five kids to avoid Roman centurions.
(Archer & Armstrong Hardcover – The Formation of the Sect – Birthday Blast)
- 7 B.C.** A Spider Alien ship crash lands on Titan, Saturn’s largest moon. There are no survivors.
(Solar, Man of the Atom #24)
- 32** Judas, upset with himself for betraying Jesus returns the thirty pieces of silver he earned for turning him in to the Council of Elders. The Council of Elders uses the money to buy farm land from a potter. The Geomancer, Jared Sahin, tells Gilad to witness the death of Jesus. The potter who sold his land asks Gilad to become his bodyguard but Gilad refuses.
(Conjecture: Assumes Jesus died in the year 32.)(Eternal Warrior #17)
- The potter catches up with Gilad as he exits Jerusalem. He asks Gilad to be his bodyguard again. Gilad refuses and leaves the potter. The potter is attacked by bandits and the thirty pieces of silver are stolen.
(Eternal Warrior #18)
- 41** Armstrong meets Upati-A-Hsu, who helps him escape from Spartans.
(Archer & Armstrong Hardcover – The Formation of the Sect – Birthday Blast)
- 48** The Sect, a multi-theosophic group that believes Armstrong is a demon and needs to be exterminated, is formed.
(Archer & Armstrong Hardcover – The Formation of the Sect – Birthday Blast)
- 60** Ivar, the Timewalker, arrives in Britain and poses as a Roman Legionary. He rescues a Celtic girl from Roman soldiers and then enters a time arc to 1941.
(Conjecture: Ivar suggests that he is in Britain at a time of revolt against the Romans. This event is placed the year Boudica lead her revolt.)(Timewalker #1)
- 79** **Archer & Armstrong Hardcover – “The Formation of the Sect – Birthday Blast”**
August 23 – Armstrong, celebrating his birthday in Pompeii, is confronted by members of The Sect. Partygoers help drive members of The Sect back.
August 24 – Mt. Vesuvius erupts. The Sect blames the eruption on Armstrong.

Gilad kills the latest incarnation of the Immortal Enemy in Abu Simbel, Egypt. He was made aware of her activities in that area by the Geomancer.

(Eternal Warrior #12)

137 Ivar the Timewalker arrives in Dura Europus for a second time. He writes himself instructions on a wall in English. He meets Ismene, a pickpocket and tells her about his first trip to Dura Europus 123 years in the future.

(Timewalker #10)

With Ismene's help, Ivar plants a bomb along one of the outer walls of Dura Europus. He rigs the bomb to go off in 123 years. He gives Ismene a bracelet with English inscribed on the inside. The bracelet has more instructions for Ivar's past self to be read in the future.

(Timewalker #11)

260 **Timewalker #10 – “The Last God of Dura Europus”**

Ivar the Timewalker arrives in Dura Europus, a city now under Roman control. The people of Dura Europus, who saw him appear through a time arc, believe him to be a god. The Roman occupiers believe he is a spy. While fleeing the Romans he meets Adria. She helps him escape from Roman soldiers. While on the run with Adria, Ivar sees some graffiti in 20th century English telling him to keep the girl with him. He knows that only he could have written that message. He tries to escape over the city walls but finds the Persian army on the other side, poised for attack.

Timewalker #11 – “The Last God of Dura Europus, Part 2”

Ivar joins the Romans in their fight against the Persians. As the city falls Ivar is able to help Adria to safety through the back of the city after a bomb Ivar planted in his future goes off.

300 Gilad Anni-Padda fights alongside Tiberious Theodopolous. When Tiberious dies Gilad gives his widow his helmet.

(Conjecture: The helmet looked to be from this time period.)(Eternal Warrior #3)

380 Gilad meets Virgilia, a roman woman, and they become lovers.

(Eternal Warrior #41)

387 Aric Dacia, a Visigoth, is born.

(X-O Manowar #0)(X-O Manowar Hardcover)(Editor's Note: Valiant Voice #2 places this event in 385.)

395 Alaric I becomes king of the Visigoths.

(X-O Database #1)

Stilicho, the Commander and Chief of the Roman military, and Alaric fight against each other for the first of many times.

(X-O Manowar Yearbook #1)

December 29 – Aric rests against a tree and contemplates his future.

409 **January 1** – Aric, using the weaponry of his armor, buries himself alive.
(X-O Manowar #9)

410 Alaric I leads the Sack of Rome.
(X-O Database #1)(X-O Manowar Yearbook #1)

During the sack of Rome Gilad attempts to rescue his lover Virgilia but he is too late.
(Eternal Warrior #41)

430 A statue is made in Rome of a woman holding a mask. The statue will eventually end up in Gilad's private collection.
(Eternal Warrior #32)

452 Gilad, protecting a pass in the Alps, fights against the forces of Atilla the Hun. Atilla asks Gilad to join him and show him another way through the Alps. Gilad agrees.
(Eternal Warrior #32)

500 Incans in South America begin chewing coca leaves.
(Conjecture – Dr. Aguilla says the Incans have been doing this for thousands of years. Archaeology suggests that the chewing of coca leaves began in the 6th century.)(Turok Dinosaur Hunter #28)

537 Gilad, assuming the identity of Arthur Pendragon, fights against his son Mordred at the battle of Camlan. Mordred is killed and Gilad is greatly wounded. The Geomancer Nimue, also known as the Lady of the Lake, takes Gilad to Avalon to heal. She tells Gilad to give up the identity of Arthur so that his legend will go on.
(Eternal Warrior #31)

Merlin enters a gateway into the Lost Land.
(Conjecture: After the events in Eternal Warrior #31.)(Turok Dinosaur Hunter #25)

680 Mayan manuscripts are found that have the “coming at you through the wall” trope found in 20th century comics.
(PunX #2)

700 Ivar visits his brothers Gilad and Aram.
(Archer & Armstrong/Eternal Warrior #8)(Editor's Note: Armstrong says he hasn't seen him for 961 years but this seems to be another of Armstrong's exaggerations.)

793 Gilad defends the Celts along the Northumbrian Coast from religious invaders.
(Eternal Warrior Yearbook#1)

- 970** Gilad hunts down Cardinal Plaegius, the latest incarnation of the Immortal Enemy in Rome, Italy.
(Eternal Warrior #13)
- 992** Gilad and Aram get into a brawl with one another.
(Eternal Warrior #3)
- 1066** King Harold II leads his men against the Normans at Senlac Hill in Hastings. During the battle Harold is snatched though time and deposited to 1992.
(Archer & Armstrong #10)(Archer & Armstrong #11)
- 1132** Gilad travels to Ladakh and visits Tashi Khatun, the Geomancer. He prophesizes that Gilad will return to Ladakh one day for the book of Geomancers, a book that Khatun will one day author.
(Eternal Warrior #9)
- 1141** Tashi Khatun begins writing the Book of Geomancers.
(Conjecture: Khatun says he's been writing it for "over fifty years.")(Eternal Warrior #9)
- 1180** Gilad returns to Ladakh. While there Tashi Khatun attempts to create a Tulpa, a necromantic double of himself to train his successor. Khatun loses control during the ritual and the Tulpa is created from his vanity. Gilad fights the Tulpa and it disappears.
(Eternal Warrior: Fist and Steel #1)
- Gilad and Khatun witness the rite of Chod, a ritual that can be used to stop the Tulpa.
(Eternal Warrior: Fist and Steel #2)
- 1190** Gilad and Armstrong aide Richard I, the King of England, in the Crusades.
(Archer & Armstrong #24)
- 1191** Richard I's brother John sits on the throne in England. His Sheriff drains the country of taxes. Lokinbar, a young knight and the nephew of the Arch-Bishop, is trained in archery by Robin Hood.
(Eternal Warrior #25)

Archer & Armstrong #25 – “The Root of the Problem, Part 1, or What I did to Infuriate the Sect”

June – Gilad and Armstrong are tasked with looking after Lokinbar during the Crusades. The three get involved in a barroom brawl and are scolded for their bad behavior by Richard I. Gilad discovers a catapult that Phillip II of France plans to use against Saladin, the leader of the Islamic opposition.

Eternal Warrior #25 – “The Root of the Problem, Part 2”

June – Lokinbar is sent to visit Lady Phoebe, who is guarded by the Knights Templar. Phoebe is thought to be chaste and virginal, but she is actually a spy for Phillip II. Phoebe attempts to seduce Lokinbar but he denies her advances. After hearing about Phoebe, Armstrong goes to her camp. They couple and she is impregnated.

November – The Knights Templar discover that Phoebe is pregnant and search for Armstrong. When the Knights Templar find him, he discovers that the fastest way to escape from them is Phillip II's catapult. He launches himself into a Mosque in the city of Acre that was built by Saladin's father-in-law. The Knights Templar swear to hunt Armstrong down. Saladin swears to get revenge on Richard I for destroying the mosque, and Phillip II is upset because his plans to defeat Richard I are ruined.

1192 Gilad enlists the aid of a man named Ali for a trek through the Himalayas to Ladakh.
(Eternal Warrior #9)

Gilad encounters the latest incarnation of the Immortal Enemy at Mangyur and defeats him. Gilad continues his voyage to Ladakh. Tashi Khatun dies after completing the Book of Geomancers.
(Geomancer #1)(Editor's Note: During this time period the Immortal Enemy appears to be in two places at once; see 1194. Perhaps the spirit of the Immortal Enemy escapes and inhabits another body.)

Gilad arrives in Ladakh shortly after the death of Tashi Khatun. He retrieves the Book of Geomancers.
(Eternal Warrior #9)

1194 Gilad hunts down the Immortal Enemy in England and kills him. The Immortal Enemy is reincarnated in Africa.
(Editor's Note: The dialogue seems to suggest that the Immortal Enemy is the Sheriff of Nottingham. One of the men thought a basis for the Sherriff, William de Wendenal, disappeared in 1194 after losing his office. This time period fits the best with this timeline. The dialogue also suggests that Gilad is Robin Hood, but we know this isn't true because Lokinbar would have recognized him 3 years earlier.)(Eternal Warrior #29)

1197 Gilad travels to Japan in search of the next Geomancer. He meets Kozo Tokimasa and begins training him.
(Eternal Warrior #27)

1219 Gilad hunts down the Immortal Enemy in Africa. The Immortal Enemy has learned the power of necromancy. Gilad kills him and the Immortal Enemy is again reincarnated.
(Conjecture: Assumes the Immortal Enemy is 25 in his new body.)(Eternal Warrior #29)

1250 Gilad kills the Countess Bettina Olavashky in Transylvania. The Countess was killing children and bathing in their blood thinking it would keep her young.
(Conjecture: The mid 1200's.)(Eternal Warrior #39)

1320 Gilad and Sahbel spar in Greece. Sahbel is training to become the next Geomancer under the tutelage of the current Geomancer Arani.
(Eternal Warrior #28)

Gilad, with the help of the new Geomancer, Sahbel, fights the Baron Darkuul in Transylvania.
(Secret Weapons #6)

- 1348** The bubonic plague, also known as the black plague, spreads across Europe. The Spider Aliens are responsible.
(Turok Dinosaur Hunter #18)(Editor's Note: Date is historical.)
- 1350** Gilad and the Geomancer Sahbel destroy a cave that was used to create necromantic spells.
(Eternal Warrior #22)
- 1359** Gilad comes before the Pope Innocent VI demanding that the White Company, a group of mercenaries in the employ of the Vatican, get paid for their work. After much persuasion the Pope agrees.
(Eternal Warrior Yearbook #1)
- 1360** Cadmus, a Pilgrim, leads a group of plague victims to a church in Canterbury, England where they will be granted sanctuary. Cadmus and his followers die beneath Canterbury Cathedral.
(Ninjak #11)(Ninjak #12)
- 1363** Gilad begins hunting down Malloch, a sorcerer who has gained power by finding Judas' cursed thirty pieces of silver. Gilad fights against Malloch's followers.
(Conjecture: Gilad says he was plagued by Malloch "for a hundred years.")(Eternal Warrior #25)
- 1429** **May 8** - Joan of Arc, the Geomancer, leads the siege of Orleans during the Hundred Years War. Gilad fights by her side.
(Geomancer #5)
- 1431** Joan of Arc, the Geomancer, is captured by the English. Gilad attempts to rescue her but she refuses to be helped, knowing that her death would make her a martyr to the French. She is burned at the stake.
(Geomancer #5)
- 1453** Gilad tracks down the sorcerer Malloch to Northern Ireland. Gilad is unable to stop Malloch.
(Eternal Warrior #19)
- 1463** Gilad defeats Malloch by killing him in a fire.
(Conjecture: Gilad says it was "years" later.)(Eternal Warrior #19)(Eternal Warrior #25)
- 1497** Gilad is captured by Father Sebastian during the Spanish Inquisition. He is tried, and found guilty of selling his soul to the devil and is sentenced to death by being burned at the stake. Gilad escapes.
(Eternal Warrior #5)
- 1498** Ivar the Timewalker travels to York, England where he is attacked by a knight. Ivar catches a time arc to 1998. The knight follows him and is killed in the time arc.
(Timewalker #9)
- 1500** Construction begins on a Chateau twenty miles from Angouleme, France.
(Conjecture: Contains architecture from the last "five centuries.")(Archer & Armstrong #7)

- 1519** Leonardo da Vinci dies in France. Gilad is present during his final hours.
(Eternal Warrior #21)
- 1593** **Late May** – Gilad is attacked by the Immortal Enemy, known in this life as Hiermonio, while with his friend Christopher Marlowe. Marlowe is killed and the Immortal Enemy escapes.
(Eternal Warrior #30)
- 1595** The Sarn and the Virlyat people of Groznia begin a bitter blood feud.
(Conjecture: Starn Mulak says there has been “centuries” of fighting.)(Eternal Warrior #41)
- 1625** Having arrived from the Cretaceous Period, Ivar the Timewalker, stands side by side with d’Artagnan against Cardinal Richelieu. Ivar catches a time arc back to the year 1998.
(Timewalker #4)
- 1644** Ivar, the Timewalker, studies swordsmanship under Cyrano de Bergerac.
(Conjecture: Some point during Cyrano’s life.)(Timewalker #1)
- 1650** A Sioux Indian girl, the latest incarnation of the Immortal Enemy, murders the chief of her tribe. Her legs are cut off and her lips sewn shut.
(Conjecture: No date was given for this event.)(Eternal Warrior #4)
- 1654** Henri VII is imprisoned in the Bastille.
(Conjecture: Henri said he had been in the Bastille “for year upon countless years.” Event is placed to coincide with Louis XIV coronation.)(Archer & Armstrong/Eternal Warrior #8)
- 1661** **Archer & Armstrong/Eternal Warrior #8 – “The Musketeers!”**
December 21 – Ilysee, under the instruction of Gilad, beds d’Artagnan and then convinces him to help her rescue a man from the late Cardinal Richelieu’s Bastille. Duchess Angelique D’terre, the Geomancer, steals a ring from King Louis XIV.
- December 22** – Aram, Gilad, Ivar and d’Artagnan, also known as the Musketeers, rescue the man in the iron mask from the Bastille. It is Henri VII, the twin brother of Louis XIV, and the true heir to the throne.
- December 23** – Gilad expresses doubts with the Geomancer about their plans to help Henri retake the throne. Henri forces himself on Ilysee.
(Editor’s Note: The date says 1659, but it is still 1661.)
- December 24** – Louis the XIV, who had been injured by a hawk the day before, has a Christmas Gala at the Royal Palace. Henri, who is about to take the throne, does not have the same injury, so Ilysee scratches his face. Henri kills Ilysee. Gilad kills Henri. Louis XIV, the lesser of two evils is returned to the throne.
- December 25** – Ivar confronts Gilad about his misjudgments with Henri. They end up getting into a bar-room brawl. Aram intervenes and knocks Gilad unconscious.

- 1670** Ivar, the Timewalker, studies swordsmanship with d'Artagnan for a second time.
(Conjecture: Ivar says he studied with him when he was young and "when he was old.")
(Timewalker #1)
- 1689** Gilad participates in the Glorious Revolution helping William III attain the English crown. For his deeds Gilad is made the Duke of Wyinthorp. During the revolution Gilad fights Victor II, the latest incarnation of the Immortal Enemy.
(Eternal Warrior Yearbook #2)
- 1692** A stained-glass window in the upper levels of the Sistine Chapel is built.
*(Conjecture: Mahmud says it "was centuries old.")**(Archer & Armstrong #4)*
- November** – Annabella Hawthorn is found guilty of practicing witchcraft in Salem, Massachusetts. Nathaniel Prudence, the man who conducted the trials is abducted by Spider Aliens.
(Secret Weapons #7)
- 1695** Gilad fights Victor II, the Immortal Enemy, and kills him. Gilad's bride Abigail has a baby which is the Immortal Enemy reincarnated. Abigail, knowing that Gilad and the Geomancer wish to kill her child, gives the baby to Mona, her servant, to raise.
(Eternal Warrior Yearbook #2)
- The Zwolle Colony is destroyed by a spaceship that crash lands on it.
*(Conjecture: Late 1600's.)**(PunX #1)*
- 1714** The Immortal Enemy rises to power as a pirate known as Captain Corbin.
(Eternal Warrior Yearbook #2)
- 1716** **Eternal Warrior Yearbook #2**
 Gilad hunts down and kills Captain Corbin, the Immortal Enemy.
- 1718** Gilad kills a man posing as Blackbeard.
(Eternal Warrior #46)
- 1720** Jahk'rt creates a holding cell that she hopes to imprison Ivar the Timewalker in someday.
(Timewalker #9)
- With the help of the Geomancer, Gilad tracks down the real Blackbeard and kills him.
(Eternal Warrior #46)
- 1750** The Place of Many Alike, a religious order that trains twins and triplets to become assassins, is founded.
*(Conjecture: "Founded centuries ago.")**(Bloodshot #47)*
- 1752** Esau Vestment kills the French pirate who captured him in Gijon, Spain, and takes the name Captain Red.
(Turok Dinosaur Hunter #13)

- 1754** After ransacking the Northern Sea, Captain Red sails to America to hide his treasure. There, in a cave, he gets transported into the Lost Land.
(Turok Dinosaur Hunter #13)
- 1756** Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart is born.
(Timewalker #14)
- 1768** Mozart stops listening to the music of Bach.
(Timewalker #14)
- 1775** General Richard Montgomery leads an attack on Quebec City and dies. Gilad Anni-Padda fights beside Montgomery in the battle.
(Eternal Warrior #9)
- 1776** Nathan Hale gives a speech before being hung by the British Redcoats.
(Archer & Armstrong #2)
- 1777** Gilad, leading a band of pirates in the Caribbean, attacks a British ship with Lady Samson on board. Samson is a spy smuggling money to be used against the American Colonies.
(Eternal Warrior #45)
- 1779** The Shawnee Indian city of Chillicothe is destroyed. The Shawnee begin hiding their vast silver fortune in the Lost Land.
(Turok Dinosaur Hunter #39)
- 1781** **Timewalker #14 – “Abduction from the Harem”**
Having traveled from the year 1995, Ivar the Timewalker meets Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart in a Brothel in Vienna, Austria. After the encounter Ivar travels back to the year 1995.
- 1783** **June** – The Montgolfier Brothers make a huge bag of paper and linen filled with hot air and send it skyward. This is the first hot air balloon.
(Vintage Magnus Robot Fighter #4)
- November** – The first manned flight in a hot air balloon takes place.
(Vintage Magnus Robot Fighter #4)
- 1789** A set of dueling pistols are made for the Nolans, a British military family.
(Timewalker #2)
- 1791** **September 30** – Gilad attends the premiere of Mozart’s *The Magic Flute* in Vienna.
(Eternal Warrior #33)

- 1793** Karamchand, from Calcutta, India, dies and is reincarnated into a bull named Shiva's Child. The bull exhibits strong necromantic abilities, including the ability to project an image of Karamchand.
(The Second Life of Doctor Mirage #4)
- 1799** Ivar, the Timewalker, studies swordsmanship under Scaramouche.
(Conjecture: Since Scaramouche is a fictional character this event is placed during the French Revolution when the book, Scaramouche, is set.)(Timewalker #1)
